Experience the lifestyles of people living in Minnesota between 1800 and 1870 through story-telling and interactive, hands-on demonstrations. Tours of the restored 1856 Gideon and Agnes Pond House will be given throughout the day.

Admission for Adults: \$10, children ages 4-17: \$5, under age 3: free.

Pond Dakota Mission Park is located at 401 East 104th Street. A food vendor will be on site and there is plenty of free parking.

Frontier Game Day Saturday, July 3, 1-4 pm

Try your hand at outdoor games such as Walking on Stilts, Graces, Stick-and-Hoop, and Marbles. Experience frontier fun, and challenge your family to a friendly competition. Bragging rights will be awarded!

Whimmy Diddles Saturday, July 10, 1-4 pm

This mysterious mechanical toy originated in southern Appalachia, then made its way west. It goes by many different names including Gee Haw Stick, Hooey Stick, and Whammy Diddle. Make one to take home using basic hand tools and see if your friends can guess how it works. Adult supervision needed for children.

Historic House Tours Saturday, July 17, 1-4 pm

Take a tour of the historic Pond House and see how their home was furnished in 1878. Hear stories of the courageous Pond family and their mission work with the Dakota people.

Start Horsing Around! Saturday, July 24, 1-4 pm

Try your hand at throwing horseshoes — maybe you'll get a ringer! Learn the rules and strategies of this ever popular, centuries-old game. Horseshoes will be provided.

Bread & Butter

Log Cabin Building Saturday, August 7, 1-4 pm

Bring your muscles to the historic Pond House and build a 4' log cabin! You'll assemble the pre-cut, notched timbers to create a mini frontier home. Can you figure out where each log goes? Learn about the compound angled dovetail joinery that was used to lock the log corners together.

Frontier Laundry Day Saturday, August 14, 1-4 pm

Compete to scrub, rinse, wring, and hang out your laundry faster than your opponents. Frontier chores were never this fun. Discover why families were so pleased when washing machines were invented!

Joseph Coursolle's 1855-56 Dakota Mixed-blood Claimant Affidavit

Sunday, August 15, 2 pm

Jane Hayden-Hart, an independent researcher, will share her findings about her Coursolle family history and the 1855-56 Sioux Affidavits. These were taken by commissioners from persons attempting to establish mixed blood status in order to receive benefits from the treaty signed at Prairie du Chien in 1830.

Mystery House Tours Saturday, August 21, 1-4 pm

Examine the historic Pond House from the outside-in! What are the mysterious markings on the bricks, why is the window glass wavy, and why is there a door on every side of the house? Correctly answer these and other curious questions to win a detective gadget.

Prairies and Pollinators Saturday, August 28, 1-4 pm

Prairies and pollinators have both played incredibly important roles in Minnesota for thousands of years. River Rendezvous Saturday & Sunday, September 25 & 26 10 am – 5 pm



Interpretive signs describing the history of the Dakota in the Minnesota River Valley, and Gideon and Samuel Pond, missionaries who arrived in 1834, are located along the walking trails in the park. The 1856 Gideon and Agnes Pond House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The park is open daily until 10 pm.
