Please join us for a tour of important Dakota sites in the Twin Cities area including:

8:30 am	Meet at Oak Grove Presbyterian Church (2200 W Old Shakopee Rd, Bloomington 55431)
9–10:00 am	Bde Maka Ska (formerly known as Lake Calhoun)
10:30–11:30 am	Coldwater Spring
1–2:00 pm	Oheyawah (Pilot Knob)
2:30–3:30 pm	Fort Snelling Prison camp where 1,600 Dakota women, elders and children were imprisoned, and more than 130 people died during the winter of 1862–63.

The tour will focus on Bdote, the center of the Dakota homeland, how it was taken over by the United State Government in the 19th century, how Dakota people were exiled from the state, and how they have returned to their homeland. The tour will be guided by Jeff Williamson, John Crampton, Thomas Shaw, Corinne L. Monjeau-Marz, Syd Beane, Bruce Forbes, and others whose descendants, both native and white, were at these sites.

Participants will provide their own transportation, lunches, and admittance to the Fort Snelling State Park (annual state park pass or \$7 daily permit per vehicle). Participants will receive maps and relevant historical materials. A free will donation of \$10 or more will be accepted. The tour will be outside, so dress for the weather. OCTOBER

Dipping Candles

Saturday, October 2, Drop-in program 1-4 pm

Try your hand at dipping candles, and make one to take home! Learn first-hand why the Pond family was so pleased when kerosene lamplight became available.

Mystery House Tours

Saturday, October 9, Drop-in program 1-4 pm

Examine the Pond House as a history detective! What are the mysterious markings on the bricks, why is the window glass wavy, and why is there a door on every side of the house? Correctly answer these and other curious questions to win a detective gadget

Native Beading

Saturday, October 16, Drop-in program 1-4 pm

Make your own bead project to take home with Lakota artist Carol Charging Thunder. Carol has been beading for over 50 years. Some of her beadwork has been exhibited at the Tweed Museum of Art in Duluth. All supplies will be provided.

The Battle of Shakopee Sunday, October 17, 2 pm

David Schleper will speak on the Battle of Shakopee in 1858 when about 150 Anishinaabe warriors ambushed a group of Dakota and their leader, Sakpedan, near presentday Shakopee. The battle lasted for five hours until the Anishinaabe retreated north toward Lake Minnetonka. Learn about the Native and white people who were there.

Jumping Jacks

Saturday, October 23, Drop-in program 1-4 pm

A favorite toy for frontier children, Jumping Jacks are flat figures whose joints are connected to a pull string. Pull the string and the Jumping Jack will dance. Now you can make your own vintage Jumping Jack to take home! All materials provided.

Braid a Mini Rug

Saturday, October 30, Drop-in program 1-4 pm

Try out this frontier craft while making your own coastersized "rug" to take home. Choose fabric strips, learn to braid them, then hand stitch your braid into a mini rug. All materials provided.

Rope Making

Saturday, November 6, Drop-in program 1-4 pm Use a simple rope-making tool to fabricate a section of rope to take home. Learn all about rope – a very important item on the frontier.

He'll also talk about Dakota burials at Bloomington Cemetery and Gideon Pond's Dakota burial ground. Jeff is descended from 10 early missionaries to the Dakota.

Interpretive signs describing the history of the Dakota in the Minnesota River Valley, and Gideon and Samuel Pond, missionaries who arrived in 1834, are located along the walking trails in the park. The 1856 Gideon and Agnes Pond House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The park is open daily until 10 pm.
