

Are you ready to apply for a Rental License?

Per City Code, "For all initial applicants, if the rental license is not issued **within 60 calendar days** of the date that <u>both</u> the rental license application and license fee is received, the application will be cancelled. Therefore, the applicant must reapply by completing the license application again and paying the required license fee and any additional fees if applicable".

Step 1: Verify Ownership:

If property was recently purchased, has your ownership been confirmed by Hennepin County? City Code requires a rental license be held by the owner of the property.

To verify ownership, go to http://www16.co.hennepin.mn.us/pins/addrsrch.jsp

It can take 3-5 weeks after the closing for Hennepin County to update ownership. If it is not updated, you can contact Hennepin County Recorder's office at 612-348-5139.

If your rental property is associated with a business, then the business must be registered and active, with the Minnesota Secretary of State. Verify at: https://mblsportal.sos.state.mn.us/Business/Search

Step 2: Fill out application (2 pages) and make payment:

By mail with a check or by email with a credit card. https://www.bloomingtonmn.gov/sites/default/files/rental_housing_application.pdf

Step 3: Schedule and Pass a Rental Inspection:

Review the Checklist found on the City of Bloomington website, www.bloomingtonmn.gov/housing "A Practical Guide to the Housing Maintenance Code".
