









Assessing

- Values and classifies all property in the city annually, a total of \$17 Billion in value
- Manages appeals on commercial, industrial, and apartment properties in Minnesota Tax Court
- Thoroughly reviews 20% of the approximate 32,000 parcels each year. All properties are reviewed within each 5-year cycle
- Performs statute driven cyclical work
- Provides the Annual Assessment Report to ensure public trust and transparency
- Presents valuation and property tax trends and analytics to City Council, executive leadership and other interested community partners.





Assessing – Moving to the Future

- Recent and upcoming departures from the team have led/will lead to many decades of lost commercial, industrial, and apartment experience
- New technology and third-party data sources will be leveraged to alleviate this loss of knowledge






Planning
