IMMUNIZATIONS AND FLU SHOTS

Immunizations available by appointment for people with no or partial insurance. A donation of \$20 per vaccination is suggested but not required. Find your COVID-19 vaccine at Vaccines.gov.

PREGNANCY AND PARENTING SUPPORT

- Individual education and support for pregnant people, new parents and families. In-person or virtual home visits provided by Public Health Nurses or Community Health Workers.
- Promote healthy pregnancy and early childhood development through learning opportunities, developmental screenings and referrals to community resources.
- The Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Supplemental Nutrition Program provides nutrition education, counseling, and food benefits for eligible people who are pregnant, breastfeeding, or have children up to five years old.
- Breast/chestfeeding information and support provided by certified lactation staff and WIC Peer Breastfeeding Counselors.
- The Follow Along Program supports parents by assessing your child's growth and development up to three years old.

SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

Provide health counseling and resource information to individuals and groups.

OLDER ADULT HEALTH

Assess health concerns, connect individuals and families to local resources, and offer support to community organizations.

HEALTHY COMMUNITIES

Promote well-being through active living, healthy eating, and commercial tobacco-free living, supported by funding through the Minnesota Department of Health's Statewide Health Improvement Partnership (SHIP).
