School-Based Substance Use Prevention and Education Services

Purpose

The City of Bloomington Public Health Department (BPH) is partnering with Fraser to deliver school-based youth substance use prevention programs in Bloomington, Edina, and Richfield (BER).

Aligned with BPH's mission to promote, protect, and improve community health, these programs will educate and empower students, families, and staff to address Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) and co-occurring mental health conditions.

The initiative will foster peer support, strengthen protective factors, reduce the impact of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), and connect youth and families to community resources to support long-term recovery and overall well-being.

Goals

To support school-based substance use prevention programming for youth in BER using opioid settlement funds.

- 1 **Increased Awareness and Education:** Expand education efforts to ensure understanding of substance use risks, prevention strategies, and harm reduction.
- 2 **Reduction in Substance Use and Improved Resource Access:** Expand access to prevention and recovery programs, aiming for a reduction in substance use across all student demographics.
- 3 **Changed Behaviors, Healthy Decision-Making and Empowered Youth:** Empower youth to make healthy decisions through peer connection and increased awareness.
- 4 **Trauma-Informed, Collaborative Approach:** Schools, public health, and community partners will use trauma-informed practices to ensure students access prevention and recovery services.
- 5 **Data-Driven Impact and Sustained Community Collaboration:** Ongoing data collection and community engagement will track progress and sustain long-term substance use prevention efforts.

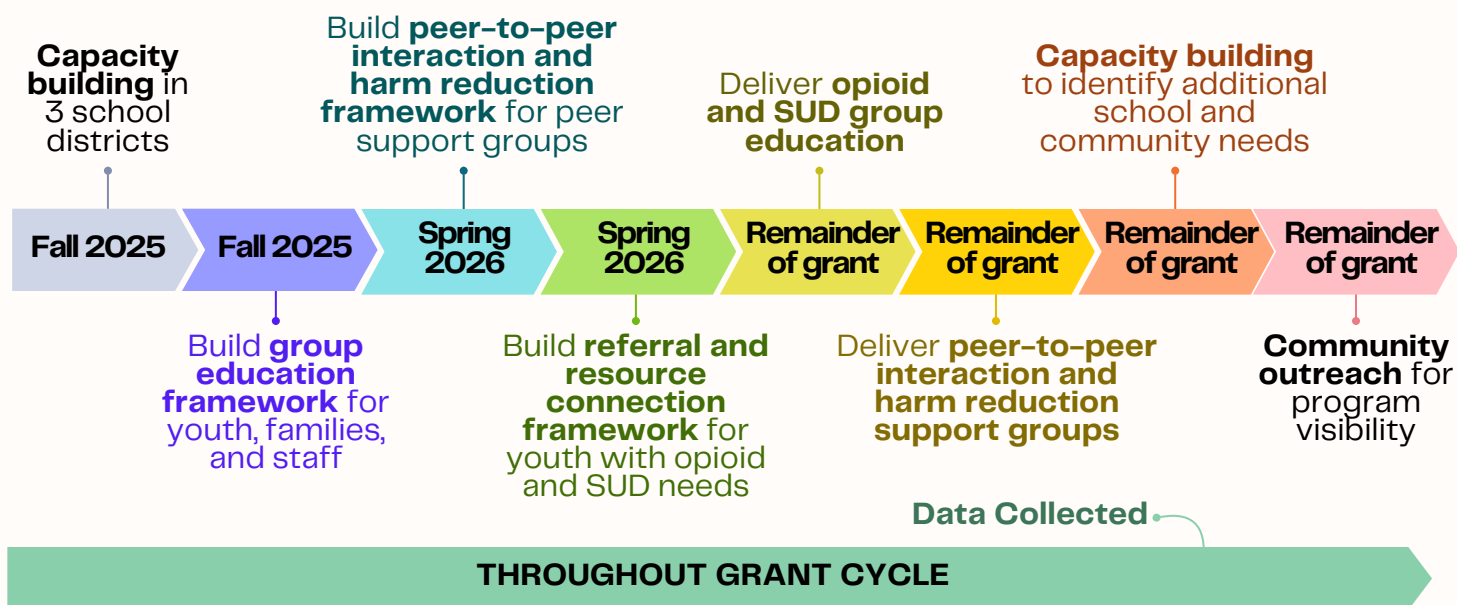
