

Definitions

Approved accessory structure: A structure accessory to a residence which is impervious to the elements and is inaccessible to rodents and other pests, and which has obtained all permits, variances and other approvals required by the City Code for its construction.

Fireplace cord: A stack of wood that is 4 feet wide by four feet tall by eight feet long.

Firewood: Dry, clean wood such as "Presto Logs", charcoal or cordwood used or intended for use as heating fuel inside a residence or for an outdoor recreational fire. Firewood does not include wood that is green, with leaves or needles, rotten, wet, oil soaked, or treated with paint, glue, or other preservatives; construction debris; or refuse.


Neat, secure stack: A stack of firewood that is piled in a regular, orderly arrangement that is stable and reasonably resistant to collapse.

Exceptions


None of the storage specifications shall apply to firewood stored within a home, garage or other approved accessory structure.

Storage

- 1. Except for firewood and construction materials necessary for on-site work, no wood or wood product shall be kept or stored upon a residential premises.
- 2. Firewood may be stored upon a residential premises solely for use on the premises and not for resale.
- 3. All firewood shall be stored as follows:
 - (A) Firewood shall be stored in neat, secure stacks;
 - (B) The height of a woodpile over three feet shall be no more than twice its width, but in no event shall the height exceed six feet;

- (C) No firewood shall be stored within 10 feet of any side or rear property line; except that if the wood is stored in an accessory structure the accessory structure shall meet all zoning setback requirements;
- (D) No firewood shall be stored in the front yard;
- (E) All firewood shall be screened from view in accordance with Sections 19.50(a)(5), 19.52 of the City Code unless the total amount of firewood stored on the premises is no more than a fireplace cord and it is stacked next to the home.
