Who are we? Human Services provides support to multicultural individuals and families, people with disabilities, immigrant and refugee individuals and families, adults age 50 and older, youth and families with low income, and individuals and families who are homeless. Our vision is to strengthen Bloomington residents' quality of life by addressing relevant community issues through expertise, resources, and partnerships. Our mission is to assure human services needs are met through the engagement of Bloomington residents.

Human Services provides a wide array of programs, assistance, and services to the Bloomington community and partner organizations.

Contract Services

Grants and in-kind support to nonprofit agencies and community partners give residents convenient access to human services resources.

Resident Support Services

Assists in connecting residents needing services to local organizations, faith and business communities.

Community Programs

Creating opportunities of inclusion and equity, programs and events are developed in response to the changing demographics in Bloomington through engagement of residents. Examples include Kite Day, welcome meals, veteran's appreciation events, and more.

Active Adult Programs

Human Services provides a unique opportunity for older adults in the community to engage in planning, developing, and implementing their own programs and services at Creekside such as woodshop, rock shop, ceramics, music, poetry, fitness and wellness, brain fitness, and card groups. Activities keep participants happy, healthy, and socially connected to their friends and neighbors.

Food Resources and Meal Programs

Staff and volunteers support Fare For All, a cooperative food buying program, and cosponsor the annual Share in the Feast Thanksgiving meal. Meal programs include a weekday lunch in partnership with Optage Senior Dining and a weekday evening meal in partnership with Loaves and Fishes. Both programs allow individuals and families to stretch their food budget.

Americans with Disabilities Act

Human Services staff acts as the City Council-appointed Americans with Disabilities Act designee. Staff addresses and advises on areas of facility and program accessibility. In addition, the ADA designee is responsible for handling ADA complaints and inquiries for the City of Bloomington.

Volunteers

Human Services works with over 275 volunteers annually in a variety of capacities including its food programs, community events, and programs for age 50 and older.

Creekside Community Center

Creekside offers 24/7 rental availability, meeting room space, notary services, free Wi-Fi, a library, and a place to gather and meet new friends.

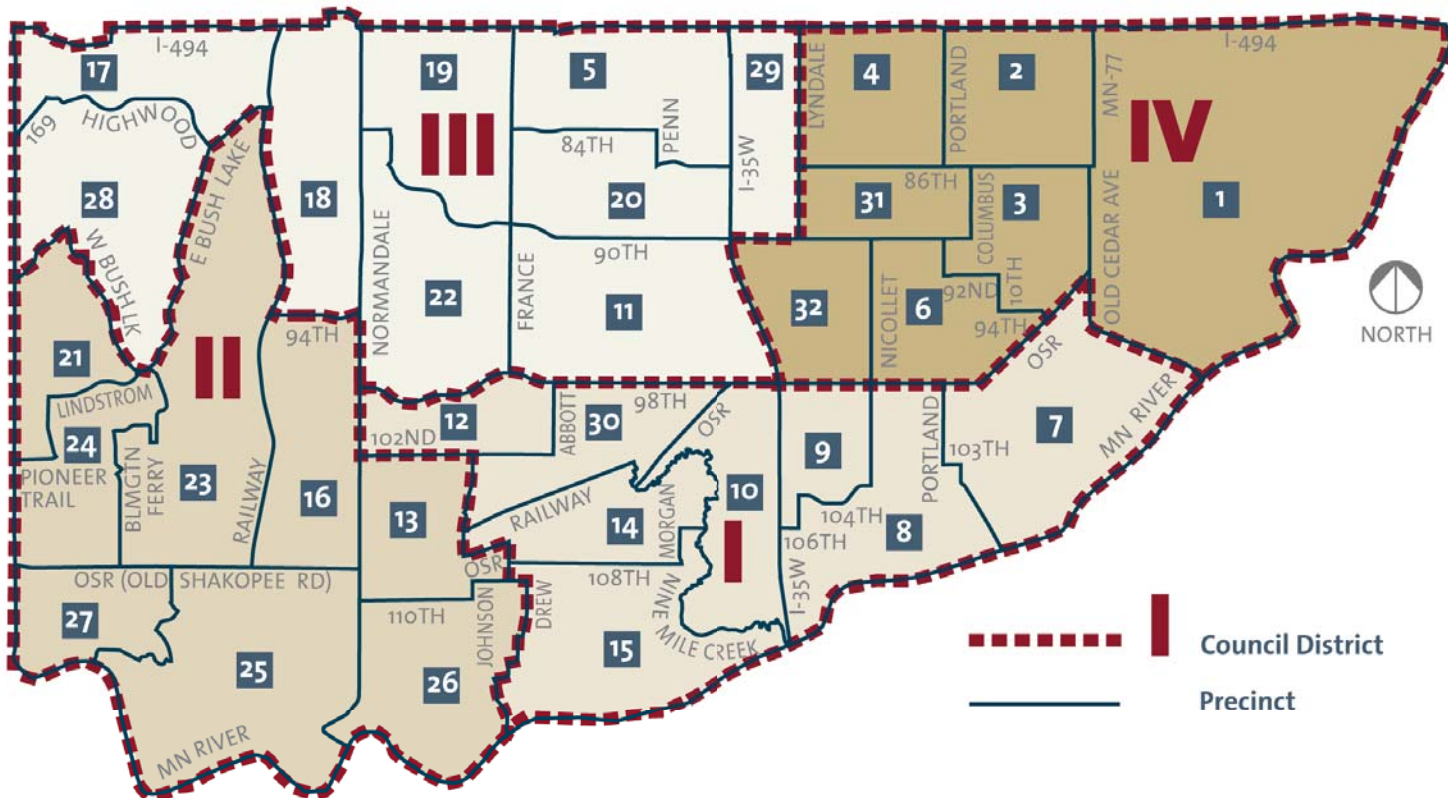
