# 2018 Community Health Survey Data Book

# **Funding**

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## Introduction/Purpose

The 2018 Community Health Survey for the Cities of Bloomington, Edina, and Richfield was designed to understand the health of residents of these cities. The questions used in the survey are based on questions from the Minnesota Department of Health and Hennepin County Adult Survey of the Health of all the Population and the Environment (SHAPE) (Hennepin County Public Health, 2019), as well as input from staff and community partners.

This data book includes the results of the survey. These results will be shared with the community in 2020, and from the outcome of those conversations, a final report about the data will be produced. The intent is for the community to drive how we understand this data and use it for our work to improve community health in Bloomington, Edina, and Richfield.

#### **Key Findings**

Staff identified some key findings for discussion with the community. Over a number of health measures, certain demographics showed poorer health compared to others.

Non-White respondents had higher percentages of:

- diabetes
- smoking
- binge drinking
- food insecurity

Non-White respondents had lower percentages of:

- physical activity
- fruit and vegetable consumption
- routine health and dental care

Other groups such as those with disabilities, renters, and those with housing insecurity also reported poorer health measures compared to other demographic groups. Participants from nearly all (97%) demographic groups agreed that affordable housing and job opportunities were somewhat or quite limited in the community. All but one of the demographic groups also selected increasing affordable housing as one of the top three things that could improve the community's health.

# **Methodology: Data Collection**

The survey used quota sampling methodology, which is a non-random way of soliciting survey responses from a population. Surveys were collected until quotas were met for specific population subgroups, including city of residence and race/ethnicity of respondents. Quota surveys are more likely to garner responses from people traditionally underrepresented in random sample surveys (Black, Indigenous and people of color; low-income people; people that rent; young people for example); however given that responses are not collected randomly, results only describe the specific group of people that responded and cannot be used to explain the health of an entire population.

The survey was primarily distributed online via social media between May and November 2018. Facebook ads were used to promote the survey online. Respondents were instructed to only fill out the survey once per household. BPH held a weekly raffle for gift cards for the first six weeks of the survey. In order to be eligible to receive a gift card, recipients had to complete the entire survey (only upon completion were they directed to a web page to enter the raffle), and otherwise be eligible to complete the survey (live in one of the three cities and be over the age of 18). Survey responses were not connected to raffle entries and multiple raffle entries were not permitted.

After the initial 7-week online collection period until pre-specified quotas were met, staff did outreach to specific demographic communities that were not well represented in the results. Some of these surveys were completed on paper and manually entered into the online survey. Surveys were translated into Somali and Spanish in order to reach community members with limited English proficiency.

A demographic profile of survey respondents is included in Table 1.

# **Methodology: Data Analysis**

Data was processed and cleaned using data best practice; more detail on the data cleaning can be found in Appendix A. Data is suppressed when there are four or fewer responses in a response category. Suppression is done for privacy reasons; data is also less reliable at lower counts.

Post-stratification weighting was used to adjust the survey results to match known demographics of Bloomington, Edina and Richfield. Unless otherwise noted, the results in the data book are weighted by age and sex based on 2017 American Community Survey five-year estimates (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018). Responses by race and ethnicity were weighted by the specific race/ethnicity composition of each city.

#### Limitations

Due to the methodology we used to collect data, survey results reflect the health only of respondents that took the survey and are not considered a representative sample of the entire population of Bloomington, Edina and Richfield.

Also for these reasons, confidence intervals and statistical tests of significance were not calculated on the survey results. These results should also not be compared to probabilistic surveys, like the Hennepin County Adult Survey of the Health of all the Population and the Environment (SHAPE), without caveats due to the methodological differences in the two surveys.

# Race/Ethnicity

In the tables in this data book, race and ethnicity are reported separately. People who chose not to identify a race were classified as Unknown race, and people who chose not to identify an ethnicity were classified as Unknown ethnicity.

Respondents' race was classified based on their self-identification among race categories determined by the United States Census Bureau: White, Black or African American, Asian or Asian American, American Indian or Alaska Native, Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, or Other. Black or African American respondents were able to further identify as African American, East African (Somali, Oromo, Ethiopian, or another East African country), West African (Liberian, Nigeria, or another West African country), or other. Asian or Asian American respondents were able to further identify as Southeast Asian (Hmong, Cambodian, Laotian, Thai, Vietnamese, or Burmese) or other. Write-in answers were allowed for the "other" option and these answers are reported when there were at least five respondents reporting the same write-in answer.

Ethnicity of respondents was classified as Hispanic or non-Hispanic. People who wrote Hispanic, Hispano, Ispano, Latino/a, South American, Mexican, Mexicano, Spanish, or Puerto Rican in the race field were classified as Hispanic.

Table 2 shows the number of respondents reporting each specific race or race combination.

For race-level comparisons in the subsequent data tables, people were grouped based on broader categories using the following criteria, which are illustrated in Table 3:

- Respondents that selected only one of the following races were put into that race category: White, Black or African American, American Indian or Alaska Native.
- The Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander category was combined with the Asian or Asian American category to form the new category Asian or Pacific Islander. Respondents that identified with either of the former two categories were placed in this new category.
- Respondents that selected White and only one of the other listed races were categorized into the non-White race group.
- Write-in answers from the "Other" response option were put into a corresponding race category if possible (for example, "Norwegian" was categorized as White, and "adopted Korean" was categorized as Asian).
- Respondents that selected two or more non-White races were not reported in the race-level data.
- Respondents that only selected "Other" and wrote in Hispanic, Hispano, Ispano, Latino/a, South American, Mexican, Mexicano, Spanish, or Puerto Rican were not reported in the race-level data. Their ethnicity was classified as Hispanic if they had not already self-identified as such.
- Respondents that selected "Other" and wrote in a race that could not be fit into the U.S. Census Bureau race categories were not reported in the race-level data.

# **Reading Data Tables**

Data tables (tables 4-53) list the unweighted sample size (the number of people in each demographic group that responded to the question) along with the weighted percent of each response by group. People who did not answer the question were not included in the calculations of the weighted percentages. Some questions were only asked as follow-up questions for those who responded a certain way to an earlier question. In those cases, the weighted percentages are calculated using only the people who were asked the question. When this is the case, the title of the table will contain the phrase "among [sub-group]" to indicate that the question only applies to that subgroup.

Weighted percentages should be read by row. For example, the first line in Table 4 indicates that 1,294 Bloomington residents responded to the question "In general, would you say your health is...?." After weighting those answers by age and sex, 86.6% of those people answered that their health was good or better, and 13.4% answered that their health was fair or poor.

## **Appendix A**

### **Data Cleaning**

The survey was conducted using Survey Monkey. A limited number of paper surveys were used for the survey and then entered into Survey Monkey. Upon survey completion, the results were exported from Survey Monkey and were compiled into a database. Data was cleaned and calculated using the statistical software R, SAS, and SPSS. Some questions had answers grouped into categories, and write-in answers were classified into the appropriate category or put into a new category that fit the response.

Some survey answers that were obviously incorrect were corrected to the assumed correct value; for example, a height of 165 inches (13.8 feet) was changed to 165 centimeters (5.4 feet).

Because the survey was intended for adults only, anyone who did not report an age, or reported an age under 18 years old, was excluded from analysis. People who did not mark Bloomington, Edina, or Richfield as their city of residence were also excluded. In paper surveys, if an incorrect zip code was reported but an eligible city was reported, the survey was still included with zip code omitted.

Because sex was used as a factor in calculating survey weights, anyone who did not select a biological sex at birth was not included in the survey tables.

If a question was skipped and not answered, that person is not included in the table for that question, but is included for the questions they did answer. If a demographic question was skipped or not valid, the person is not included in that demographic section of each table, but is included in the demographic categories they did indicate.

#### **Calculated Variables**

- Housing insecure: answered yes to missing or delaying a rent or mortgage payment because they did not have enough money
- Disability: answered yes to usual use of assistive devices, needing help with daily functions like bathing or getting dressed, or using hearing devices.
- Income: calculated based on income and household size. People who reported 0 adults living in their home were analyzed as 1 person in the household. Incomes were categorized into either under or over 200% of the 2013 federal poverty level. The categorization of poverty is detailed in Table 56.

9 or more	\$100,000

- Cigarette smoking status:
  - Current smoker: person has smoked at least 100 cigarettes in their entire life and now smokes cigarettes every day or some days
  - Former smoker: person has smoked at least 100 cigarettes in their entire life and now smokes cigarettes not at all
  - o Never smoker: person has not smoked at least 100 cigarettes in their entire life
- Binge drinking:
  - o For females: 4 or more drinks on one occasion
  - o For males: 5 or more drinks on one occasion
- Household composition
  - o Children: person reported at least 1 child 0-17 years old living in their home
  - No children: person reported 0 children 0-17 years old living in their home
- BMI:
  - o BMI was calculated only for people who reported a height between 3 and 8.5 feet and a weight above 60 pounds.
  - o Weights and heights were converted into meters and kilograms to comply with BMI formula.
  - o BMI was calculated using the equation BMI= weight/(height²) and categorized:
    - BMI <18.5: underweight
    - BMI 18.5 <25: normal weight
    - BMI 25 <30: overweight
    - BMI ≥30: obese
- Community health improvement items:
  - Write-in answers were examined and either put into an existing answer option or put into a new category that was created based on the answer.
